OTTAWA, May 4.—Men of 19 years of age are called upon to register for military service. A proclamation to this effect will be issued shortly and, it is understood, will provide that the men must register before June 1. None of the men will, however, be actually called to the colors before July. The proclamation will apply to unmarried men and widowers without children born since Oct. 13, 1897.
