WOULD LIKE GIBRALTAR. France and Russia May Support Spain's Demand for Its Surrender.

PARIS, Nov. 13.—The speech of the Italian Ambassador at the Lord Mayor's banquet in London, on November 9, is causing angry comments from the French press. Referring to the visit of the British squadron to Toronto, he said: "The Italians have no need to go into rapines or to turn on their heels and make out what receiving foreign guests." This was plainly a reference to the Franco-Russian fete and has caused very bitter remarks regarding the friendship existing between England and Italy.

Some papers go so far as to intimate Italy may yet regret her display of friendship for England, and that the combined French and Russian squadrons in the Mediterranean are capable of dictating terms to any combination which Italy and England may present in the Mediterranean or elsewhere.

This feeling has brought forth renewed suggestions that France and Russia should support Spain in her demand for the surrender of the "Key of the Mediterranean" and that England must on no account be allowed to establish herself in any position opposite Gibraltar.

Another Plot Suspected. MADRID, Nov. 13.—Three more Anarchists were arrested here last evening. Numerous warnings had been sent to brokers here that the Anarchists were plotting to blow up the Bourse. Saturday and Friday, therefore, the attendance was restricted to holders of special admission tickets.

The Anarchists held a meeting in Barcelona yesterday to celebrate the outrage in the theatre. The Anarchists did not have the meeting until it was nearly over and arrived at the hall too late to make any effect.

The police caught the Anarchist Navarro who was seen leaving the theatre on the evening of the explosion.

LESSON, Nov. 13.—Three Anarchists, who distributed manifestos calling for a meeting in this city in memory of the "Chicago martyrs," have been arrested.

End of the Trouble. SAN SALVADOR, Nov. 13.—Minister Young telegraphed to the Honorable Minister of Foreign Affairs asking if his Government accepts the responsibility for the act of the Anarchists who had not been Amplea when he fired upon the Pacific mail steamer Costa Rica, when she was flying the American flag.

The Government of Honduras promptly disavowed the conduct of its officers and expressed sincere regret for the occurrence. A cable message from Minister Young establishes the fact that the shots were fired at the Costa Rica with the intention of hitting her, and not as was thought at first, across her bows for the purpose of bringing her about.

SPAIN'S POSITION. No Money to Put the Extra Forces on a War Footing. MADRID, Nov. 13.—The great expense to be entailed by calling the three years' reserve to their colors has excited grave apprehensions among the members of the Government.

It is difficult to see how in the unfavorable conditions of Spain's finances the necessary money can be raised to put this force on a war footing and perhaps send it to Mexico.

More meanness is felt here owing to the growth of the anti-English sentiment among the lower classes. A special patrol was set at the English embassy last evening, to protect it from any hostile demonstration. It is reported that French agents are stirring up the people with stories of English interference in Morocco.
