A War Memorial Committee Named

Project Discussed at Public Meeting Last Night---Several Forms Which a Memor al Might Take Discussed and Also Amount of Money Required. GeneralCommittee Named and Recommendation Passed That City Council Get Authority to Make Substantial Grant.

At a public meeting held at the Council Chamber, City Hall, last night a general committee of eighteen members were named to take up the project of erecting a War Memorial in this city, and a resolution was pages suggesting that the City Council obtain authority to provide, a substatial grant for the purpose.

Several forms which a memorial might take were discussed and the suggestion was made that the city of Prederiction might co-operate with the vincial memorial in this, the capital city. Representatives of the returned soldlers favored a Soldlers' Home or memorial building of some kind, while others favored the erection of a suitable statue. The attendance at the meeting was disappointing, there being not more than forty present. In opening the meeting, Mayor Hanson stated that the meeting was called to discuss the desirability of erecting some form of a memorial to those from this city who gave their lives in the Great War. He welcomed those present at the meeting and asked for their co-operation. 
