



The Prince of Wales Arrives at Toronto.

Americans Abandon Pursuit of Mexicans --- Hungarian Government Resigns.

THE PRINCE AT TORONTO.
TORONTO, Aug. 25.
The Prince of Wales and party arrived at Toronto this morning. The Prince was greeted as he blithely walked off Royal train by the Premier of Ontario and other authorities. All streets and thoroughfares in the neighborhood of the station were thronged with cheering citizens, while the battery, manned by artillery veterans of Sanctuary Wood, Vimy Ridge and Cambrai thundered Royal Salute across the Don Valley. The Prince was driven immediately to Government House. At noon a formal address from Province and City will be present at the Provincial Parliament buildings and this afternoon His Royal Highness will open the Canadian new Colonial Exhibition.

ABANDONED PURSUIT.
MARFA, TEXAS, Aug. 25.
Three hundred and seventy-five United States cavalrymen who last Tuesday entered Mexico in pursuit of bandits who held Lieuts. Peterson and Davis for ransom were back on American soil to-day. Following the abandonment of the chase yesterday, the troops to-day resumed patrol of the border. Heavy rains yesterday which obliterated the trails of the bandits brought the decision to abandon the chase after contract had been made with Carranza's troops. Lieutenants Geo. Kpyco and W. L. Poquet, U. S. Army aviators, reported missing below the Rio Grande yesterday are safe.

JOSEPH'S GOVERNMENT RESIGNS.
PARIS, Aug. 25.
The resignation of the Hungarian Government of Archduke Joseph previously reported in press advices was announced in messages received by the Supreme Council to-day.

THE FILM LADY—Her Adventures.
There are many film "stars" whose faces are so familiar that an audience applauds directly they appear. No name on the screen is needed. But there are few "stars" who would stand the test of continual appearance day after day and week after week without tiring the public. Yet Miss Pearl White, the leading "serial" film "star" of the day, whose performance in "The House of Hate" has interested audiences all over the country, has accomplished the feat. The more frequently she appears the more her popularity seems to grow. Twenty-eight years of age, with

dark, curling hair and blue eyes, Miss White's life has been a succession of "thrills." She was born in the Ozark Mountains in the United States, and appeared when a child as Little Eva in "Uncle Tom's Cabin"—a part many famous film actresses have played in their time. Then she went to school for six years, and then circus life attracted her. She became a "bare-back" rider. And after that she returned to the stage.

This varied experience proved of the utmost value when five years ago she was given the leading part in "The Exploits of Elaine"—one of the first carefully constructed serial films.

It is not an easy thing to be a serial heroine. The life is strenuous.

Miss White worked for thirty weeks on the twenty parts of "The Fatal Ring." In eighteen episodes she had a fight. In three she dangled by a rope from the top of a high building and had to pull herself up hand over hand. She had to jump into a cargo boat and climb from the water into a cargo boat. She was thrown downstairs. And she fought on a narrow girder running between the roofs of two high buildings.

Miss White is a fatalist. She thinks it a matter of chance whether she is killed while acting a "thrill." She has come unscathed through many dangerous acting experiences, and yet she broke her ankle by slipping on a kerystone. Four of her brothers and one sister died as the result of accidents. A little delay saved her own life once. She had arranged to go up in an aeroplane with an American airman, but she did not arrive in time. He went alone and was killed by falling 2,000 feet, when making a spiral descent.
In her newest film serial, "The Lightning Raider," which will be before the public in November, Miss White is not relying so much upon "thrills," as upon a battle of wits between the characters.—C. R., in Daily Mail.
