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**Can Cancer be Cured?**

**EXPERT PHYSICIAN SAYS: "YES!"**

Although civilized peoples have to a great extent succeeded in stamping out of the more fearful diseases, cancer has not only been stamped out, but is actually increasing. In fact, cancer mortality has increased five-fold in fifty years, while the population has only a little more than doubled.

Why should this be so? Dr. Robert Bell, an expert on the subject in the "Journal of an Old Physician," explains the theory that cancer is a disease of the blood, caused by self-poisoning continued over a series of years. The malignant cells, which we call cancer, are really a symptom of the disease.

Therefore, Dr. Bell affirms, cancer is preventable. No one can contract it. Weeds cannot grow in foul soil, and the fungus spores of cancer can only propagate themselves in a human system that has been fouled for a long period and thereby prepared for their production.

The foulness is produced mainly by wrong dieting, which in its turn leads to constipation and the retention within the system of poisonous products which nature intends to expel.

People need never contract cancer if they will pay proper attention to their diet, keep the bowels emptied at least once a day, and use an unmeasured amount of pure water between meals, so as to flush the system.

It would have us reduce the quantity of animal food to a minimum, substituting white fish, chicken, eggs, and fresh fruit and vegetables, with elemental bread, all of which are rich in vitamins.

But this cancer has once made its appearance, can it be cured? This is the question that is vital to tens of thousands of sufferers.

Dr. Bell says that it can, and he offers three cases in proof of his infirmity. The majority of the patients referred to had been discharged from hospital as incurable, and in each case they had been told that they had a short time to live.

In nearly every case the author was able to restore them to health, and this without having recourse to any knife, in which he is no believer. The man was suffering from an incipient cancer and had lost three stones weight. Under Dr. Bell's care he regained his previous weight, and was engaged in the arduous duties of a London fireman.

The twenty-one years Dr. Bell was the physician of the Glasgow Hospital for Women, and during seven of these years he constantly performed operations for cancer. In every instance, he tells us, the case returned with increased force, as he proved on his mind that, in fact, it had been determined that he would not be able to operate again for this disease.

He has, however, instead, he endeavors to restore Nature in her efforts to cure disease, and he produces a mass of evidence to prove that, in the main, he has been highly successful.

**What Causes "Singing" in the Ears?**  
Hearing is due to vibration of air passing upon the tiny drum of our ear, which are translated into sounds to be picked up by the brain.

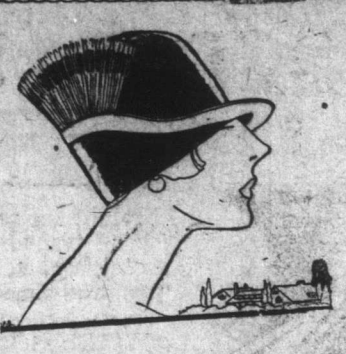

Again, the tube whose purpose it is to have the air pressure in the ear the same as outside, perhaps as the result of a cold, in which case our balance of air will be out of proportion, and we listen to the tiny beats of our blood, enormously magnified by the drums of the ears.

For the wax which is always forming in the ear, the result of natural secretion may be removed quickly enough. This system, and here again we are liable to get an improper "pressure," just as though something were accumulating in a real drum, resulting in the sound we know as "singing."

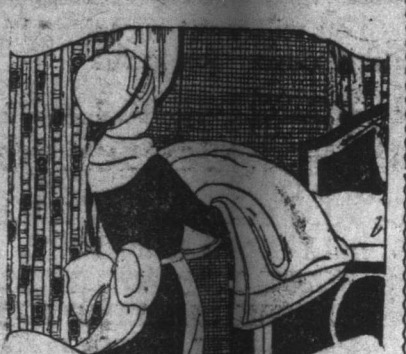
