

A BULL DAY

In the Chicago Grain Pit-Farmers Took the Board of Trade by Storm.

Chicago, Dec. 5.—"King" Farmer came to Chicago today, and took the board of trade by storm and sent prices of all grains climbing above records. Natural conditions are back of the upshoot in prices, but bull speculation has been the main incentive. The whole countryside seems to be waking up to the ruinous shortage in the corn crop, and the feeding of wheat as a consequence has brought big buying in that cereal.

Today the floor of the board was a spectacular show. Hundreds of the big countrymen, in fur overcoats and cowhide boots had the courtesies of the exchange and were all eagerly "getting into the game." When professional speculators saw the farmer grasping opportunities they immediately began to plunge. Added to this influence was a flood of general buying orders from the country until the outside interests practically control the

markets. May wheat touched its record price for the crop shortly before noon, selling at 80%c. Both December and May corn broke records of years' standing, December selling at 65c and May at May cats broke another record to-

day at 4614c.
At the high prices enormous amounts of grain came out, supposedly from the operators. Prices rapidly sagged.

DISCOVERED AN INDIAN GRAVEYARD!

Workmen Unearth a Prehistoric Buria Ground Near Sarnia.

[Sarnia Canadian.] The workmen engaged in excavating the trench for the extension of the Gas Company's mains to Point Edward, on Friday struck what by the appearances must have been an aboriginal cemetery. The location was at the corner of Edward and Alexandra streets at Point Edward, a little south of Michigan avenue, near the Oddfellows' Hall. The trench, which is about five feet deep, was being carried through the sandy soil which there prevails, when the workmen received somewhat of a shock by unearthing at the bottom of the trench a human skull. Other skulls and bones were quickly revealed, until five almost complete skeletons had been disinterred within the narrow limits of the trench, while the striking of bones at intervals in the side of the cutting indicated that excavations to the right or left would have been equally fruitful in the grim mementoes of departed humanity. The skeletons were all apparently those of tall and well formed men. One of the skulls was remarkably large, and of an appearance which to a phrenologist would indicate for its former owner very respectable mental power. No marks of injury were observable, leading to the inference that the subjects had died from natural causes, and were not the victims of some bloody prehistoric bat-tle. The condition of the teeth in the

skulls was remarkable. They were strong and even, and none showed any indications of decay. The prehistoric medicine man, apparently, could not have found the dental department of his business much of a feature. As to the antiquity of the remains, no opinion could be passed.
