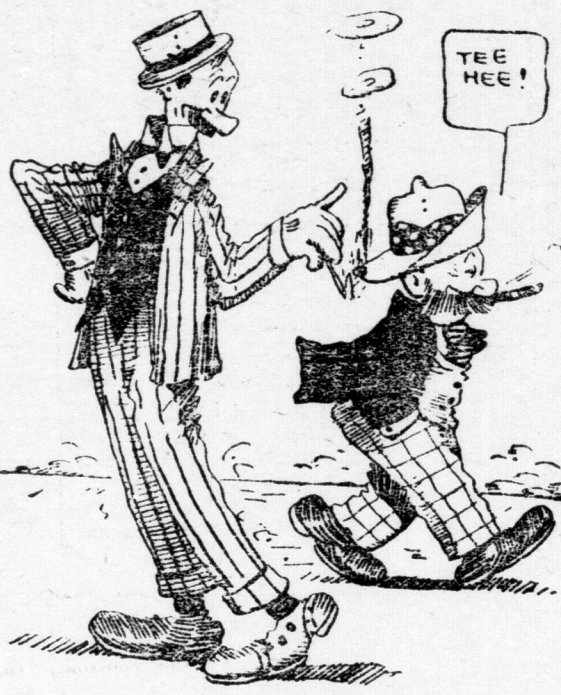

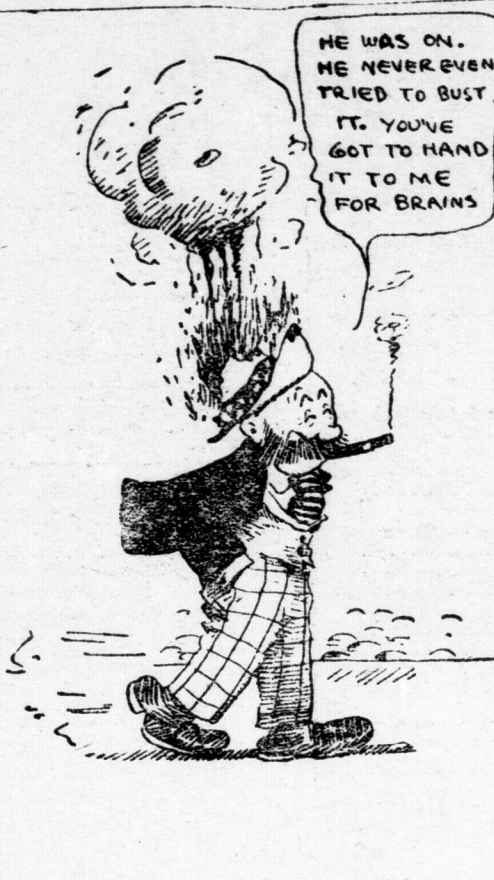

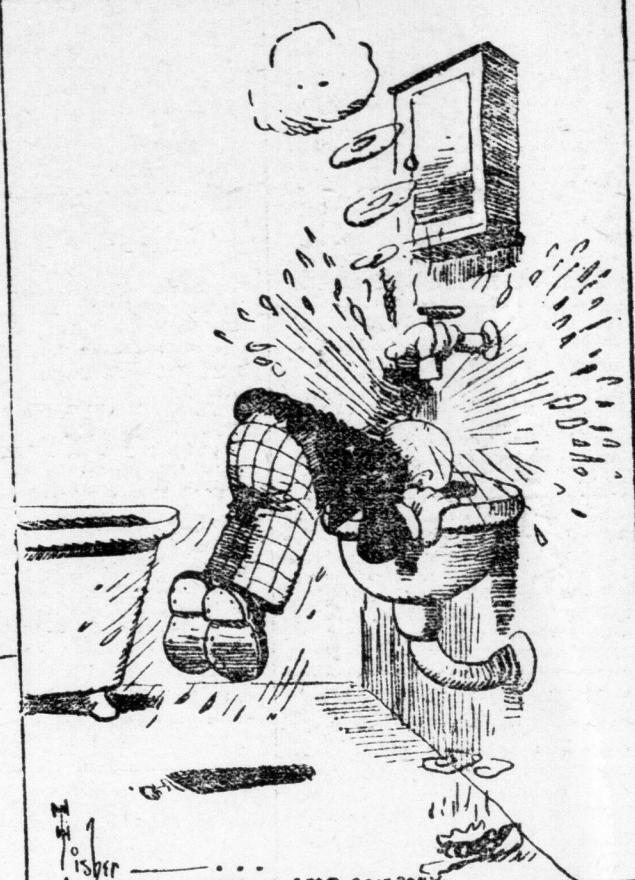

The bill would permit betting on horse racing by the pari-mutuel system, and provides for a racing commission of three members. The measure has aroused great public interest. An aggressive fight has been made for its passage, and steps aggressive have been taken to encompass its defeat.
