Western Ontario Delegation to Ask Radial Railways

City To Be Well Represented at Convention—March 26 Is the Day.

If the London Board of Trade can accomplish it, the delegation which will represent this city and Western Ontario municipalities at the hydro-radial convention, to be held in Toronto on March 26, when the Government will be memorialized to grant a subsidy for radial roads in the province, will be even greater than the delegation which went to Ottawa last year. At a joint meeting of the board of trade and the board of control yesterday, plans for the part London would take in the convention were discussed.

Plans Big Delegation.
The board of trade decided to send a representation of at least twenty-five members, while an attempt will be made to have the council attend in a body. An effort will also be made to have representatives from the building and construction board of education, Western Fair board, public utilities commission, Commercial Travellers' Association, London Railway Commission, Middlesex Productive Association, London Coal Dealers' Association, and others, accompany the delegation.
Ex-Jayce C. M. R. Graham, Controller Moore and Rose, and E. C. Mitchell, were appointed a committee to look after transportation arrangements for delegates from outside municipalities.

Interest All Western Ontario.
Among outside points which will be represented with a view to sending representatives are Delaware, Yarmouth, Arkona, Lobo, West Zorra, Enniskillen, Arkona, Lobo, Belmont, Newbury, Mt. Brydges, Euphonia, Lunan, Springfield, East and West Nisour, East and West Williams, Alisa Craig, Watford, McGillivray, Park Hill, Adelaide, London Township and others.
The plan of the Hydro-Electric railway Association of Ontario is to have a monster deputation wait on the Government and present claims for radial roads.

STREET FLIRTATION ENDS IN DISASTER

Dr. Gordon Shows Harm of "Innocent Pastime"—Result of "Wild Oats."

"Some people say, 'there is no harm in a little flirtation on the street,' but I tell you I open my eyes often as I go down your streets and see what is taking place. Young men and young women who begin their love in this way are building on a foundation of shifting sand, and disaster follows in nine cases out of ten. Needless marriage follows and all kinds of home troubles. A secret marriage is a cruel marriage. Scores of girls who have made them and broken the hearts of parents who have never lived to regret their action."

The Devil's Proverbs.
Dr. Gordon spoke as above to a large audience in St. Andrew's Church last evening on the subject, "An Innocent Flirtation." He declared that the ten great proverbs of the Devil are: (1) There is no harm in a little flirtation; (2) if they are all doing it; (3) When you go to Rome do as the Romans do; (4) Every young man must sow his wild oats; (5) It is just my luck; (6) Every man has his price; (7) Look out for No. 1; (8) Money is your best friend; (9) The world owes me a living; (10) What's the use?

He pointed out that there are hundreds of young women who are neglecting mothers—mothers often who are ill and overworked—in order to gain selfish pleasures.

The saloon he characterized as a national nuisance and a menace to the individual.

Sanish the Saloon.
"Just as soon as ever the Christian people want to," he said, "they can blot it out forever, and they can't do it too soon."

"Any young man who pours out his physical and mental strength in sowing so-called wild oats is worse than foolish. All who sow the wild cannot fail to reap the whirling dervish in doing this they generally risk their soul, often not realizing it until too late."

"One," he said, "who stopped to think could declare that money is one's best friend. John Jacob Astor when the Titanic was going down would have given all his wealth to save himself, but could not. Andrew Carnegie declared he would give \$200,000,000 for ten years more of vigorous life, but could not have it."

"Money," he said, "is trivial compared with many of the real things. There is absolutely no question about it that anyone's best friend is Jesus Christ."

"Napoleon Bonaparte," he declared, "was the world's most awful example of what happened to the man who says 'Look out for No. 1.' Napoleon sacrificed the lives and happiness of millions absolutely without regard for anything except his own personal gratification, and he died alone and hated."

Dr. Gordon announced next meetings in St. Andrew's for Sunday afternoon and evening.

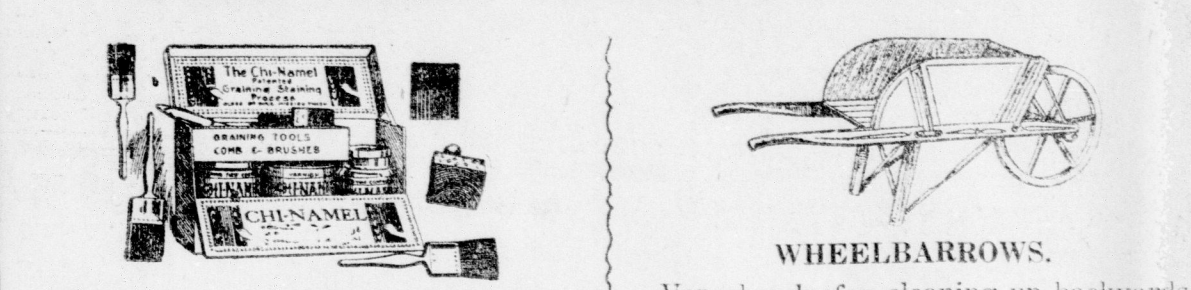

TESTING BOTTLED-UP BATTLESHIPS AT KIEL

CAPTIVES ON ISLAND.

Santiago, Chile, March 19.—Three hundred of the crew of the German cruiser Dresden sunk off Juan Fernandez Island, have been transferred to Quinquina island, in Talcahuano Bay.

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
