UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA PLANNED
Draft Bill Prepared by Union Committee For Submission To Parliament.
TORONTO, Sept. 22.—The machinery for the creation of the United Church of Canada as the desired result of the church union movement contained in its draft bill for the Canadian parliament to consider, provides against any possible coercion or compulsion of any congregation to join the union or any taking of church property by the United Church against the will of the owning congregation.
Today the draft bill was placed before the joint committee on church union when it met in the Metropolitan Church and it was found that it contains express provision for the "dissenting" congregation of any of the three churches concerned, Methodist, Presbyterian or Congregational, to dissent as far as they like and to take their property with them, with the proviso that their equity is to be determined by a commission created for this purpose.
TORONTO, Sept. 22.—"Most careful consideration has revealed that there is no legal obstacle in the way of church union." This was the unanimous conviction registered by the joint general conference of the Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational churches which, under the chairmanship of Rev. Dr. Chown, met in Metropolitan Church today to deal with the vital issue of church union as embodied in the proposed federal act to incorporate the United Church of Canada.
Contrary to expectations, some of those outside of the joint conference who were reported to be none too favorably disposed to the proposed amalgamation of interests, and in spite of the fears, perhaps, of a num-

CHAINS MAN TO RAILWAY TRACK

Joseph Kolis of Richmond, Michigan, Meets Terrible Death.

Victim Believed To Have Been Unconscious When Placed On Rails.

DETROIT, Sept. 22.—Joseph Kolis of Richmond, Mich., was beaten unconscious, chained to a rail of the Pere Marquette near Wesson avenue, and left to be mangled by the first train which passed, Deputy Coroner Ed Conley said today after investigating the man's death. Police first thought Kolis fell from a train while stealing a ride.
Mr. Conley declared that a heavy iron chain had been found near the spot where the body lay, one end passing under the rail in a manner which suggested that Kolis had been tied to the tracks. The wheels of the train had severed not only Kolis' body, but the heavy chain, which, officials said, might easily have derailed the train.
The deputy coroner said Kolis was unconscious when chained to the rail. Had he been conscious he could have wiggled out of the loosely-tied links, whose size prevented formation of a tight knot, Conley said.
Police are searching the vicinity for a girl said to have seen two men fighting on the Pere Marquette right-of-way last night. They have not yet found her.
Kolis had been working for a farmer named Karash, near Richmond, Mich. He was a lumberjack by trade, but has been out of the woods for some time, the sister-in-law said. She said he was single, and, as far as she knew, without enemies. He had a sum of money on his person last night.

ALBERTA OFFICER SHOT ON DOORSTEP
Posses Scour Country With Bloodhounds For Suspected Slayer.
COLEMAN, Alberta, Sept. 22.—Constable Stephen O. Lawson of the Alberta provincial police, was murdered here early last evening at the door of his combined home and office by a man suspected to be Emil Picarrillo, known throughout the Crow's Nest Pass as "Emperor Pic."

The slayer was accompanied by a woman and the pair are being hunted by posses of police and citizens aided by bloodhounds. The arrests have been made. Sam Picarrillo, son of the fugitive, Loss Andre and a third man named McAlpine, mechanician for Picarrillo, are held by the police as having knowledge of the crime, and a fourth man, whose name was withheld, is accused as a material witness.
Lawson was talking to his wife when he was called to the door. When he opened it four shots rang out, two bullets taking effect and causing almost instant death.
The firing was done, it is alleged, by a man and a woman in a powerful touring car, whose engine was kept running and which was speeded up immediately the four shots were fired.
The police assert that the murder followed Lawson's action of Constable Lawson in firing on Sam Picarrillo, son of "Emperor Pic," in the afternoon. Young Picarrillo was driving on the Coleman road in a car said to contain liquor.

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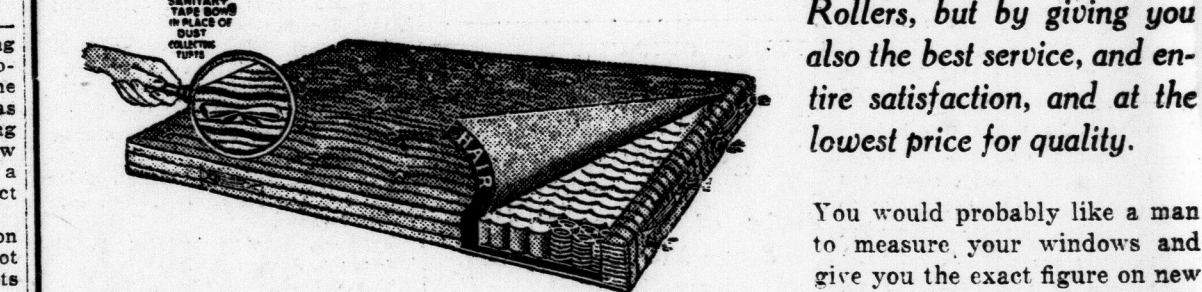
