> Prostrations and Deaths from the Heat.

Buffalo, June 28.-Despatches received to-day report 20 cases of prostration and two deaths from the heat at Milwaukee: 20 cases and four deaths at Cincinnati. At Chicago the breeze did not appear until the excessive heat had made a record of eight fatal cases of prostration in the city since daylight. The preceding 24 hours marked the culmination of the almost nnprecedented period of warmth. According to one authority there were 18 deaths from sunstroke and 117 other cases of heat prostration, fully one dozen of which are pronounced critical.




