FIRST OF THE KIND.

An Injunction Issued Restraining the Employes of the Northern Pacific Frem Striktog.

MILWAUKEE, Dec. 26.—An injunction restraining the employes of the Northern Pacific Railroad from striking is being served on the leaders of the organizations of the employes. It is, so far as known, the first order of the kind ever issued in the United States. It is being served by the United States marshals of the district through which the Northern Pacific basses. The new schedule of wages adopted, by the receivers, which implies a cut of 5 to 10 per cent. In the employes' pay, was rejected by the employes' representatives at a conference held in St. Paul with General Manager Keedrick yesterday, and the prospects are that on Jan. 1, when the new schedule is to go into effect, the 3500 men employed on the read will try to quit work.
