

Destroy Sweepings Barn Floors and Granaries

Sweepings from threshing floors and granaries are frequently dumped in the barnyard and later hauled to the land with the manure. The sweepings from the floor and its crevices are usually fowl with weed seeds.

Unless the yard scapings or manure is thoroughly rotted most of these weed seeds will retain their vitality and produce a vigorous crop of weeds. Burning the sweepings would be a much safer method. If they contain grain, boiling will make them a safe feed for poultry or live stock


