REAL ESTATE HIGH IN SYDNEY.

Halifax, March 6.—A real estate deal involving the highest figure yet paid.

The Burchell property, a lot eighty feet by one hundred, situated on Clarendon street, the main business street of the city, has been sold for \$20,000.

The Burchell building was recently burned. It was thought that when the Canadian Bank of Commerce paid \$13,750 for a lot 55 feet frontage on Clarendon street that the record figure had been reached, but the price paid for the Burchell property goes one better.

The purchase of the Burchell property will be the largest in Sydney. The Sydney Record has secured the highest and ground floor for offices, and Montreal parties are negotiating for store space.

NEW CANADIAN PRESS ASSOCIATION.

Halifax, March 8.—The Sun's correspondent reports that arrangements are being made with the Marconi Wireless Co. by a staff of twenty-two of a press association for Canada.

The Marconi system will be used exclusively. The news collected from different parts of Canada will be transmitted to the association headquarters in Great Britain, which will be at 10,000, for distribution among British journals. Mr. Marconi is expected here in a month or two, when the station at Table Head will be formally opened for commercial service.
