The several Nations of Indians with whom the Six Nations or Iroquois are in Alliance; according to the Information given Conrad Weiser Esq; in open Council at Turpehawkin, at their Return from the Treaty at Philadelphia in July 1742.

1. A Nation of Indians living on the West Side of the Lake Erie, and along the Streights of Huron's Lake. They are called by the Iroquois, Unighkellyiakon; consisting of about Thirty Towns, each of about 200 Fighting Men.

2. The second Nation lives among the preceeding, called——— confishing of Four Towns of their own

People, and 400 able Men in all.

3. The third Nation called by the Iroquois, Tshi-fagech \* Roanu, lives on the East Side of the Huron's Lake; several of the Council have been there, and all agree they have Three large Towns of 600, 800, and 1000 able Men.

4. The fourth, called Twightwis Roanu, Two large Towns, and about 200 Men in all, live at the Heads of Huakiky River, near the little Lakes.

5. Oskiakikas, living on a Branch of Ohio, that heads near the Lake Erie, Four large Towns of about

1000 Warriours.

6. Oyachtawnuh Roanu, near Black-River, con-

fishing of Four Towns, and 1000 Warriours.

7. Keghetawkegh Roanu, upon the great River Missisppi, above the Mouth of Ohio: Three Towns; the Number of People uncertain.

8. Ker-
