The market opened dull and weak but a little manipulation sent it up one cent from the low point, the advance was taken advantage of to market stuff and it was then left to its own devices, without support it sold down to 67 for August, 63½ for September, and 61½ to 61½ for December. Corn at one time looked as if it would have an advance, but soon showed weakness and at end of day was at its lowest point.

Pork was steady at one time, but closes weak. Lard advanced on small business 10c but reacted 5c at the close.
