THE NORTH-WESTERN TRIBES OF CANADA.

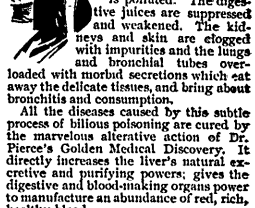

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ANTICIPATED BY SAVAGES.

It is amazing to learn from Colonel George Earl Church, writing in the Geographic Journal, that the telephone was anticipated by Indians in the valley of the Colorado. Their primitive consists of a hollow piece of wood, palm wood filled with sand, rubber, pieces of wood and hide, and inserted in a socket of ant, hide, resin, and rubber. This is struck with a club of wood coated with rubber and hide. One of these instruments is hidden in each habitant, those being about a mile distant from another, and all on a direct line north and south. The instruments are in contact with the neighborhood ones to the north and south. If not above a mile distant, response echo the blow. To this an Indian answers by striking the instrument in the habitant with which it is desired to communicate, which blow in turn is echoed by the instrument originally struck. Each habitant has its own series of signals. The outfitting it is difficult to hear a blow. Conversations by these instruments appear to be carried on in a kind of Morse code.
