The return of Mr. Hugh Law to the House of Commons as member for West Donegal supplies the very first instance of the election of the son of an Irish Lord Councillor to the British Parliament. The addition of such a man to the Irish party is also notable fact.

The Bishop of London points out with regret, in a Pastoral letter, that from the noblest Catholic families in England today, and even from the next in social rank, there are but few aspirants for the priesthood. This he regards as an unhealthy and somewhat alarming symptom which is not manifesting itself in the various dioceses alone. Nor does it augur well for the Church's growth in England. He says that he often asks himself whether the lack of vocations to the priesthood at the present day from the upper and middle class Lancashire families is the penalty of worldliness and of the keen race for wealth in the parents or arises from the children themselves, who, brought up in indulgence and ostentation, are so devoid of habit of industry, asceticism and restraint, or even of any serious purpose in life, that they have the hesitating discipline of college life or the heroism to devote themselves to God or the salvation of souls in the priestly state. The Bishop appeals to Catholic families to remember their duty in this matter.

The Japanese Minister, Viscount Hayashi, having in a recent public speech alluded to the expulsion of Spaniards and Portuguese from Japan as having occurred owing to Jesuit intrigues, has been interrogated on the subject by the Earl of Londonderry. His Excellency in reply says his statement, which was based on assertions by Japanese and Dutch authors, referred to the Jesuits who were in Japan three hundred years ago. He had no intention of going into the merits of the case, and did not bring any accusation against Jesuits at the present day.

London truth recalls that at the Coronation in 1831 the great row was about the homage, as when the "ceremonial" was submitted for approval to William IV. he vowed that nothing would induce him to go through the ordeal of being kissed by the Bishops. His Majesty did not object to the salute of the Peers, but he protested that he would sooner not be crowned than submit to being kissed by the Prelates, and he ordered that part of the programme to be cut out. However, the Archbishop remonstrated vigorously, and the King knocked under, but with a bad grace.

## "THE GAEL AND THE GREEK."

The following is a report of a lecture recently delivered in the Aula Maxima, University College, St. Stephen's Green, Dublin, under the auspices of the National Literary Society, by Rev. William Barry, D. D., on "The Gael and the Greek; the Gaelic Revival, and the Study of the Classics." Dr. George Sigerson, F. R. U. I., President of the Society, presided.

The Rev. Dr. Barry, who was enthusiastically applauded, expressed the great pleasure which he felt in finding himself once more on Irish soil (applause). It was with little reluctance that he presented himself to them, not because one Irishman ever failed to receive a welcome from other Irishmen when he met them face to face, but because one had a certain delicacy or hesitation in even seeming to offer advice or throw out any hint to those who were living at home, and who were carrying on the life of Ireland at the heart of things. Nevertheless, there was a certain advantage in those Irish who lived abroad—in those who were exiles—sometimes offering their impressions of the great currents that were flowing in the world, and saying how things looked to them, for now their race was everywhere, and it behooved them to study how the world was moving. It was on that point that he came to them that night to say something which had been for many years in his mind. He desired to submit to their consideration thoughts which he believed to be true, and which, if they were true, were important. Strong differences of opinion had been expressed touching the revival which was now going forward of the Gaelic language, literature, music and ancient customs, whether within the four seas of Ireland, in the Scottish highlands, or in English and American cities. But to no one, he thought, with an eye for the picturesque, or a heart to feel the stirrings of a deep and long struggle of patriotism would refuse his admiration, even if he withheld his sympathy. What might be the fortunes of this last effort to bring back the past they could not tell. It might grow to great things and mark an epoch in the restoration of Irish life. It might come to naught as similar movements had done before. Yet, be its conclusion what it would, the Gaelic revival was writing a brilliant and pathetic, a singularly fresh and beautiful page on the too sombre chronicles (applause). He was not concerned with the details of that movement about which everyone would have his own opinion. But he would say of its spirit that it had lifted a spell from the genius of their race and nation that seemed to be almost breathing its last, calling it into the front of battle, where prizes were yet to be won by heroic valor; creating by some subtle alchemy from dead ashes and spent fires the flowers of poets' dreams, which might well be their Celtic emblem. For by temper, as by situation, they were a people apart; and the nineteenth century, which scattered them over new continents or drove their least modern folk into the hives of cosmopolitan industry, did in this manner threaten the Irish nation with a fate worse than destruction. They were to be sucked down into a crowd that had no color of its own, no speech, tradition, character—a crowd that was the drift and wreckage of all times flowing as the wind carried it—such a crowd as he had seen in New York and Chicago of twenty-five nations flung upon the face of the earth that they might forget their traditions, their inheritance, their religion, their race, and might even transfigure their very names to be swept into a new kind of thing that had no name, no tradition, and little religion, and was merely adrift (applause). Their mother Ireland was to be a province. Her sons and daughters were to be indistinguishable from nondescript resident aliens in countries not their own. Surely that would be a loss to the world, where varieties and contrasts were essential to high achievements, where one low average brought with it decline.
