Book Notices.

MANUAL OF MYTHOLOGY. Greek and Roman, Norse and Old German, Hindu and Egyptian. By Alex. S. Murray. Published by David McKay, 23 South Ninth street, Philadelphia.

Murray's Manual of Mythology, containing a concise and clear account of the history and development of the Greek and Roman, Norse and Old German, Hindu and Egyptian mythology, is a work of interest and value to both teacher and student. It is not simply a book of reference on divinities and demigods, but deals in a very pleasing manner with the interpretation of myths, showing the great truths of nature that were embodied in them. The influence of the old myths upon our own literature is also illustrated to some extent. The book is well printed on good paper, and contains many valuable and well-chosen engravings from photographs of antique works of art, which add greatly to the interest of the work.
