PRAYERS

Bill C-57, An Act to amend the Federal-Provincial Fiscal Arrangements Act, 1972, as reported (without amendment) from the Standing Committe on Miscellaneous Estimates, was concurred in at the report stage.

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), seconded by Mr. Sharp, moved,—That the Bill be now read a third time and do pass.

And debate arising thereon;

Mr. Orlikow, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre), moved in amendment thereto,—That Bill C-57, An Act to amend the Federal-Provincial Fiscal Arrangements Act, 1972, be not now read a third time but that it be read a third time this day six months hence.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the amendment, it was negatived, on division.

And the question being put on the main motion, it was agreed to, on division.

Accordingly, the Bill was read the third time and passed.

Bill C-53, An Act to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act, No. 2, as reported (without amendment)

from the Standing Committee on Agriculture, was concurred in at the report stage, read the third time and passed.

The Order being read for the consideration of the report stage of Bill C-63, An Act to amend the Olympic (1976) Act, as reported (without amendment) from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Estimates;

Mr. Stevens, seconded by Mr. Jelinek, moved,—That Bill C-63, An Act to amend the Olympic (1976) Act, be amended in Clause 1 by striking out line 16 on page 1 thereof and substituting therefor the following:

"date 1976: and, with respect to each such gold coin, prescribe that the standard weight shall be one quarter of an ounce Troy weight of gold, the millesimal fineness shall be 916, and the remedy allowance and the least current weight shall be such as are appropriate to that standard weight."

And debate arising thereon;

Mr. McKenzie, seconded by Mr. Ritchie, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-400, An Act to amend the Senate
