VIA RAIL—INCENTIVE PAYMENTS

Question No. 143—Mr. Turner:

Does Via Rail Canada have an agreement with the railways whose track Via Rail trains travel over that involves incentive payments to the railways to keep Via Rail trains on time and, if so, what is the agreement and how are incentive payments determined?

Mr. Robert Bockstael (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): Via Rail Canada, Inc. has an agreement with the railways that provides for financial incentive payments to encourage the railways to improve train performance.

It is possible for the railways to earn up to 10 per cent of Via's gross revenues for improved train performance.

The incentive payments are determined by comparing present train performance to historical train performance which was generally based on the train performance under railway management for the period 1975 to 1977 inclusive.

Question No. 661-Mr. Howie:

Since January 1, 1978, have studies taken place regarding the possible establishment of an unemployment insurance office in Oromocto, Minto, or an additional location in Fredericton, New Brunswick?

Mr. Dennis Dawson (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Employment and Immigration): The further extension of
