Dear Mr. Titcomb:-

We are pleased to learn from Mr. A.F. Byers that you are willing to deliver the annual Somerville lecture at McGill University this year.

We should like you to come if possible on April 23rd and the lecture would take place at 8.15 P.M. on that day. We would be glad if you would speak on the subject : "Fish Life in Our Inland Waters, With Special Reference to Trout Fishing".

The audience would be a general one and would consist of some of our own staff and students, a number of members of the Fish and Game Protection Association ( a very large body in this Province ), possibly some representatives of the Government and some of the general public.

If you could bring either slides or films we could provide an operator and machine.

I understand that Mr. Byers has already told you that there is an honorarium of \$100. connected with the lecture which would include the lecturer's expenses.

Perhaps you will be good enough to advise us by what train we may expect you. There is a C.N.R. train which leaves Hartford at 11 p.m. and reaches Montreal at 8.05 p.m. On the return trip there is a train leaving Montreal at night and one from Montreal in the morning which would take you back by day.
