

PLUMS FAVORITES ON FRUIT MARKET

The Supply Large, Demand Exceeds Offerings—Prices Become Stronger.

PEARS ALSO FIRMER

Quality of Fruit Improves With Season's Advance—Green Corn Scarce.

Plums sell more readily than most of the fruit being shipped on the market at the present time, and the wholesale supply did not equal the demand.

The Bartlett pears are of much better quality than formerly sent in and consequently the price was slightly firmer—the 6's selling at 25c to 30c, and the 11's at 45c and 50c.

The overgreen corn is in such demand it is difficult to supply it. It sold at from 10c to 12c per dozen.

James Bros. had a good shipment of apples from W. J. Baker, Warkworth, Ontario, and a shipment of choice peaches from B. D. Lowery, St. David, in 11-quart leno baskets.

Weekly Statement Also Shows Drop in Circulation and Deposits.

Canadian Press Despatch. LONDON, Sept. 10.—The weekly statement of the Bank of England shows the following changes:

Total reserve, decreased £188,000; circulation, decreased £26,000; bullion, decreased £24,938,938; other securities, decreased £1,114,000; public deposits, decreased £2,114,000; notes reserve, decreased £2,018,000; government securities, decreased £2,276,000.

The proportion of the bank's reserve to liability this week is 19.81 per cent; last week it was 19.92 per cent.
