ROUMANIA TO STOP MUNITIONS TRAFFIC

Triple Entente Powers Are Asked to Supply Customs Examiners.

WILY TEUTON RUSE

War Materials for Turks Are Shipped in Beer Barrels.

PARIS, July 29.—A report from Bucharest that orders had been issued to the Roumanian officials at all frontier stations to make the most thorough examination of all freight cars owned by Austria-Hungary, Germany and Turkey, to prevent any possibility of the passage thru Roumanian territory of munitions and arms, was officially confirmed today at the Roumanian station in Paris.

It is reported that cargoes of beer barrels packed in ice, sent from Germany to Turkey, were examined and the barrels found to contain war munitions. The freight cars are reported to have been provided with false bottoms and walls, behind which arms were hidden. Every device known to modern smugglers is said to have been used to pass arms and munitions thru Roumanian for the Ottoman troops.

Roumanian With Allies.

Because of this state of affairs, the Roumanian Government has requested the entente allies powers to lend it experienced customs examiners and detectives to assist in enforcing the prohibition of transit in munitions.

"All of which," said an interested diplomat, questioned here today regarding the truth of rumors that Roumanian already had concluded an intervention agreement with the triple entente powers and was only awaiting the concurrence of Italy, "tends to prove that the negotiations for Roumanian's early entry into the war on the side of the entente allies are proceeding satisfactorily."

WAR ANNIVERSARY A DAY OF PRAYER

Ontario Government Makes Proclamation Inviting the Churches' Co-Operation.

SERVICES TO BE HELD

Brief Morning Gatherings to Be Held on Wednesday, August Fourth.

Premier Hearst, on behalf of his honor the lieutenant-governor and the government of Ontario, yesterday afternoon announced the following proclamation, which Sir J. S. Hendrie had just visited the parliament buildings to sign:

Proclamation.

Whereas Wednesday, the 4th day of August, will be the anniversary of the declaration of war and the occasion calls for fitting and solemn recognition through our province;

"We therefore, believing it to be fitting that our people should be enabled to make a public and solemn avowal of duty to Almighty God and of need of guidance, have thought fit, by and with the advice of our executive council for the Province of Ontario, to appoint, and do hereby appoint, the said day to be observed throughout our Province of Ontario, as a day of humble prayer and intercession to Almighty God on behalf of the cause undertaken by our empire and our allies, and of those who are offering their lives for it, and for a speedy and decisive victory to the end that peace shall endure;

"And we do invite all churches and all religious organizations and all our loving subjects throughout Ontario to hold and attend, wherever it is possible so to do, such public and religious services as are called for by the occasion;

"All of which premises all our loving subjects and all others whom it may concern in any wise concern, are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly."

Premier Hearst stated to The World that he wished the fact emphasized that this was not the proclamation for a holiday, but for a day for services of intercession. No doubt in many places where people are very busy with the season's work, the churches would hold brief morning services.

PROVINCIAL POLICE ACT IN BROWN MURDER CASE

W. Salt is Held Pending Further Inquiry at Port Frances.

Supt. Rogers of the provincial police received word yesterday that the provincial police at Port Frances had arrested W. Salt in connection with the murder of H. Brown, and the disappearance of his partner, Tony Ross. The man under arrest has expressed great anxiety respecting the fate of Tony Ross, and has volunteered the theory that the missing man's body is in Mountain Lake. It is understood that Salt gave the first intimation that Brown's body had been found in the dead trapper's shack.

FRENCH SUBMARINE IS APPARENTLY LOST

Officers and Crew of Mariotte Believed to Be Prisoners.

PARIS, July 29.—The following statement was today issued by the French minister of marine:

"The French squadron in the Dardanelles is without direct news of the French submarine Mariotte which entered the straits July 26 to operate in the Sea of Marmora."

"According to telegrams from Turkish sources the submarine and crew of 21 have been made prisoner."

According to a despatch from Constantinople to The Mittag Zeitung of Berlin, the Mariotte was destroyed by a German submarine on July 26 in the narrows of the Dardanelles.

MILLION DOLLAR FINE PLACED ON BRUSSELS

Germans Extort Money Because of Successful Air Raid by Allies.

PARIS, July 29.—Another fine of one million dollars has been imposed on the City of Brussels by the German authorities in consequence of the destruction of a Zeppelin dirigible balloon at Evere by aviators of the entente allies, according to the correspondent at Havre of The Petit Parisien.

A despatch from Amsterdam June 24 said that British airmen had attacked the Zeppelin sheds at Evere, to the north of Brussels, and had set fire to the building, destroying the Zeppelin inside.

PREMIER HEARST IS BACK IN HARNESS AGAIN

Presided Yesterday at Cabinet Meeting—War Anniversary Services Proclaimed.

Premier Hearst spent a busy day at the parliament buildings yesterday attending the cabinet meeting which adopted the proclamation respecting the holding of church services on the anniversary of the outbreak of the war, and dealing with other matters of public business. He appeared to have benefited considerably by his health-seeking trip to the maritime provinces, but will be away resting up most of the time until September with a view to a complete recovery from the effects of his illness.

MUST PAY UNTIL THE DISPUTE IS SETTLED

Member of Catholic Benefit Association Objected to Assessment.

At Osgoode Hall yesterday before Mr. Justice Middleton, James Drain, of Peterboro, a member of the Catholic Benefit Association, applied for an injunction to restrain the association from carrying into effect certain increases which were made in 1913. His lordship decided that until the matter is definitely settled, the petitioner shall pay his premiums to court or into the funds of the association under protest.

A settlement has been arrived at between the contractors on the Port Arthur section of the C.N.R. and Mackenzie and Mann and the Canadian Northern Ontario Railway. Foley Bros., Patrick Welsh and J. W. Stewart started action for a large balance which they claimed was due them, and placed a lien upon the whole Sudbury-Port Arthur section. By consent of both parties the action has now been dismissed.

The conviction of Fred Cook, who was fined \$50 for an alleged infringement of the transient traders' bylaw of the Village of Parkhill, has been quashed. An action has been entered by E. G. Law against the City of Toronto to recover \$12,555.58, alleged due for work and material in connection with the construction of the centre piers and abutments of the St. Clair avenue bridge.
