spirit of the Devil to their aid, and scatter terror, torment, and ruin through the world.' How it will end, it would be arrogant to predict.—We cannot fay what will happen, but we know what it is our duty to do.—It is our duty to refift the encroachments of France to the last shilling of our principal, and the last drop of our blood. Mean time, the hope of redemption from this French tyranny must dawn and rise in France itself: for, until the French people shall be able to cut off their present usurpers, and obtain a government that will fubmit to fome control from reason and humanity, neither France itfelf, nor the rest of the world, will be able to obtain the inestimable bleffings of security and peace.
