On Letters to any othor place in Canada, or

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countrios, via England, an amount equal to the postage rate

Both the postage rate and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the positive and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the "addres, forgetfulness of the casualties," may affect an Unregistered Letter.

# MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by Parcel Post, which does not extend to any place witbout the Province, is 25 cents per lb. (with 3 cents additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payablo in advance by Postago stamp, is the rate ou Printed Circuiars, Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like charac-ter, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, Brilish North America generally, or the United States.

The charge on Books, &co., by Book Post to England, is 7 cents on Packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight, 121 cents on 3/1b packets, and 121 cents ad-ditional for every additional 3/1b. These charges must be prepaid.

## NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication; addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quar-tarly in advance by either the publisher at the post office whore the papers are posted, or by the sub-scriber at the delivering post office:

When the above rates aro not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

#### TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers-that is to say, Canadisu Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of

publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid I cent each, by postago stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—ex-copt only British Newspapers d'aributed to regular subscribers by Canadian bookselers or News Agents —such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packot Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Cana-dian Packet Malis aro delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packe Mails are charged two cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

### PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS

The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not ex-ceeding 3 ounces in weight, 1 cent; over 3 ounces, 4 cents.

If prepaid by postage stamps from the office of publication, Periodicals published in Canada, weigh-ing over 3 oz., may pass for 2 cents cach.

Periodicals printed in this Province, other than Newspapers, when specially devoted to the educa-tion of Youth, (both religious and general) to Agri-culture, to Temperance, or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the office of publication, to be transmitted to any post-office in this Province are around from charge. are exempt from charge.

Transient Periodicals--including Canadian Peri-odicals not prepaid the commuted rate from the office of publication-nor exempted by the preced-ing clause, and all other Periodical publications posted in this Province, must be prepaid by Stamp, the full rate, at the time of posting.

Periodicals received in mails from the United States are charged with the rates named in the first clause of this sec.

Money Orders, payable at any Money Order Office in Great Britain and Ireland, can be obtained at any In Great branch and result, can be obtained at any Canadian Money Order Office. The Orders are of rawu in Stering, the commission coargeable being: for  $\pm 2$ and under, one abiling stering; from  $\pm 2$  to  $\pm 5$ , two shillings. No order can be drawn for more than  $\pm 5$ but any number of orders of  $\pm 5$  each may be procured.
