VIADUCT AND GOOD ROADS

Two Go Hand in Hand, Says William Hyslop.

No man knows about Toronto's roads and necessities better than Wm. Hyslop, president of Hyslop Bros. Speaking to The World last night, Mr. Hyslop said: "I am naturally in favor of anything that makes for a greater Toronto. We must enlarge the city to meet the growing demand. I believe good roads and the Bloor-street viaduct go hand in hand, and in view of the great advantage to be derived from the city cost will be a small price to pay. The city must recognize that this is not only for the present, but will go a long way towards providing for the future. It is the most important and most urgent question facing the ratepayers at the present time. The Bloor-street viaduct must come sooner or later."

Mr. Hyslop speaks with authority. Representing an investment of over half a million dollars, he has some interest in the welfare of the city, and is ready to meet his share of the burden.

SHOULD TEACHER GET SALARY?

Unusual Circumstances Affecting Application of Miss Macdonnell.

The finance committee of the board of education met yesterday, but very little business was on hand. A letter was read from Miss Ruth Macdonnell, a teacher in the Sackville school, asking that she be allowed her salary for nine weeks of forced absence from school. Miss Macdonnell was taken ill of typhoid fever, at a time when the disease was prevalent in the school, and was obliged to remain away for nine weeks of time.

It is the custom of the board to allow salary for four weeks' absence, but it was pointed out that an exception might have to be made in this case on account of the prevalence of disease in the school. The matter was finally referred to the board of inspectors for report.

HOT TIME AT MONGRIEF HAY GOES UP IN SMOKE

Good Sport Results From Fine Selling Races and a Breeders' Purse—To-day's Card.

JACKSONVILLE, Dec. 30.—Considerable excitement was caused at Moncrief Park this afternoon, when, immediately after the first race, fire broke out in the feed and implement stables along the back stretch. The heat was so intense and smoke so dense from burning hay that it was necessary to delay the races for about an hour.

Several horses stabled in the burned building were led to safety. The fire was allowed to burn itself out. The damage did not exceed \$400.
