REGISTRATION FOR NURSES.

Movement is Furthered at Largely Attended Meeting.

The need for the registration of nurses was emphasized last night at a meeting of the Graduate Nurses' Association of Ontario, held at the Normal School, under the presidency of Miss Snively, lady superintendent of the General Hospital.

The feature was an address by Miss L. L. Dock of New York, who kept the large audience interested by her arguments in favor of the state registration of nurses. Such supervision would bring about a higher standard of knowledge amongst the young women. It would prevent a worthy profession from falling into disrepute.

She strongly deprecated the teaching of nursing by correspondence. No one but the government could hope to attack the quick schools. Whether the advocates of registration would approach the legislatures was not known as yet. English nurses had been doing their eight years to bring about state registration and were now on the eve of obtaining it. In eight of the states in the United States registration had been secured.

Irving Cameron expressed his confidence that every medical man would support the movement, and Dr. Brown also voiced his sympathy as one who had been associated with the work during the past four or five years.

Without delay the resolutions reported the sympathy of the Women's National Council.

Children Helped.

A great deal of work for the betterment of the lives of children is being done in the city and in this work the Children's Aid Society have a very large part because they are the only ones that have legal powers for rescue work.

Last month alone the Children's Aid Society had the cases of 110 children under its care and was able to accomplish much to better the lives of some of them. This, after all, is the work of the society, to take care of the children who are taken from their parents either by the courts or by voluntary adoption.

Comparatively few children are taken from their parents either by the courts or by voluntary adoption. Last month six children went to foster homes, 46 were received at the shelter and 44 were discharged from it.

For Muskegon Consumptives.

London, Oct. 19.—Thomas McCormack, has arranged to erect a handsome building to house a bandstand and may not be pushed down the street since Ald. Macdonald's plan for a park and bandstand is being carried out.

The plan for a trunk sewer system, one that was prominently to the fore in last year's anti-election campaign, gives promise of being revived, as it is likely to be one of the planks in Ald. McCormack's platform.

The civic works committee claim that the delay is blameable upon the provincial board of health, into whose hands the matter passed many months ago. The board has been carrying on chemical tests, but no reports have been made.

Versatile Tradesman.

Japan has secured so many Russian war vessels that she will be able to economize on naval expenditure for some years to come. This is equivalent to cash indemnity of \$200,000 to \$300,000, besides the large addition to her mercantile marine by the merchantmen secured as prizes.
