
Talisman of Hohenzollerns.

The house of Hohenzollern possesses a family talisman in the shape of an old-fashioned ring in which is mounted a plain black stone, this quaint jewel dating from the time of the Elector John Cicero. A princess of the family had just given birth to a son when a huge toad appeared on her bed and dropped the stone out of its mouth, no doubt as a christening gift to the new-born baby. It was first set in a ring by the father of Frederick the Great, who left it, with a letter relating to its history, to his successor. Each head of the Hohenzollerns has become its owner in turn, and the present emperor frequently weers it on state occasions. Its virties as a talisman are held in great respect and one fluds a constant mention of this stone in the archives of Berlin.
