Ottawa, Aug. 7.—(Special.)—The morning
session of the Committee on Privileges
and Elections was very interesting. The
evidence of James Nelson of 414 Church-
street, Toronto, who boarded in the same
house with James Farr, the missing deputy
returning officer, going to show that Farr
was in Toronto last Friday, and that he
had been talking very freely to Nelson,
telling him that he had got \$500 and a
railway ticket from Vance, a Liberal or-
ganizer, and also that Farr had told Nel-
son that Mr. Holmes, a Liberal member
for West Huron, had thanked him (Farr),
and said he would not forget his services.
This set the Liberal members of the Com-
mittee in a flutter, and after a long
debate, the chairman ordered that Mr.
Nelson's name was not to appear in the
official report, but, as Mr. Russell pub-
licly remarked, that would not make
much difference, as it would appear in the
newspapers. Mr. Nelson's evi-
dence was so damaging that Mr. Russell
thought it necessary, although his name is
suppressed in the official report, to give
him the opportunity to explain the effect
that he had after the election, and to
make him any promise of aid.
