U. S. TREATIES WITH BRITAIN.

Reciprocity Measures Affecting the British West Indies Sent for Ratification.

Washington, Dec. 11.—The President has sent to the Senate a number of treaties with Great Britain, extending for a year the time for the ratification of the reciprocity treaty between the United States and Indian possessions, which were sent to the Senate last session, but failed of ratification.

He also has forwarded reciprocity treaties with Nicaragua, Ecuador, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica, the last named affecting the island of Puerto Rico.

The President also has forwarded his message to Congress recommending legislation for the consideration of \$700,000, of which four or five small islands to be purchased, which are not included in the reciprocity measures now before Congress.

PERTH POULTRY FAIR.

Turkeys 9 to 11 Cents, Geese 6 to 6-12, and Chickens 5-12 to 6-12 Cents Per Pound.

Perth, Ont., Dec. 11.—The annual poultry fair commenced here today. The absence of foreign buyers was particularly noticeable. About 15 tons of poultry were sold, at prices generally very favorable to the sellers. The prices of turkeys ranged from 9 to 11 cents, choice lots up to 12; geese, 6 to 6-12; chickens, 5 to 9 cents, and chickens 5-12 to 6-12 cents. The fair closes tomorrow.
