TUBERCULOSIS REGULATIONS. Patients suffering from tuberculosis transferred from England by hospital ships to Canada will not be granted leave from the hospital in which they are first placed until they have been carefully examined, first leave being granted only in cases not likely to suffer in health therefrom, or to be a menace to others while on that leave.

According to camp orders, cases are being reported continually of soldiers of the Canadian expeditionary force who have been discharged without the necessary examination by the dental officer of the C.A.D.C. Parades for dental examination must be invariably carried out before men are discharged, irrespective of whether they are considered to require dental treatment.

The department of public works has let the contract for huts on Carling Heights to accommodate 2,600 troops. These huts will be built on the south side of the parade ground, and are to be ready in about three months. The military authorities propose to use the fair grounds until these huts are ready. It is not known yet where the artillery will be housed.




