AMOUNT SPENT ON RESEARCH OF INSULATION USED FOR UNDERWATER ELECTRIC CABLES

Mr. Frank Maine (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Public Works and Minister of State for Science and Technology): 1. NRC is presently doing research on insulation for electrical cables which will be used in a wet environment. The major application of this is for cables buried in wet ground but the work is also applicable to underwater cables. The amount spent by NRC on this research from January 1, 1976 to November 16, 1977 is approximately \$130,000.
