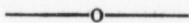

SURGEONS' REPORT.



The Surgeons of the Toronto Eye and Ear Infirmary, in presenting their Ninth Annual Report regret that they have again to complain that the efficiency of the institution is still very much restricted on account of the small and ill-adapted building in which its operations are carried on.

The number of beds for patients is limited to twelve—six for males and six for females. The number of female patients occupying beds in the institution is usually less than that of the males, and six beds in the female department would probably be sufficient for some time to come, but accommodation for male patients should be at least
