

# IS FOUND DEAD IN AUTOMOBILE

Robert Simpson of Barnesville Discovered by Companions Last Night.

Robert Simpson, aged about 48 years, postmaster, shoekeeper and farmer at Barnesville, Kings county, was found dead in an automobile which was parked on the north side of King Square about 11:20 o'clock last night by two companions, William S. Rogers, of Barnesville, and Medley J. Reed, of Sussex, who had been with him earlier in the evening.

The two men notified Police Constable Alex Chisholm and the officer conveyed the body in the automobile to police headquarters. Coroner William Warwick was summoned, viewed the body and gave permission for its removal to Chamberlain's undertaking rooms, Mill street.

Mr. Simpson leaves, besides a wife, two sons, the oldest being about 21 years old, at Barnesville, and one sister, Mrs. Leslie J. Jones, 28 Leinster street. The sister was notified of her brother's death and her husband drove to Barnesville early this morning to break the sad news to the family of the deceased.

According to the story told by William S. Rogers last night, he accompanied Mr. Simpson in an automobile from Barnesville yesterday. Mr. Simpson brought to the city with him two pigs and 100 pounds of butter which he sold to local merchants. While in the city they met Medley J. Reed, of Sussex, who was in their company for a time. The automobile was parked in the north side of King Square, opposite the Park Hotel and when Messrs. Rogers and Reed left to have something to eat and requested Mr. Simpson to accompany them, he refused, stating that he did not want anything to eat but would remain in the car.

Found Dead in Car.

The two men partook of an evening meal and then went about the city for a few hours and when they arrived at the car about 11:20 o'clock last night they were surprised to find Mr. Simpson lying on the floor of the car, dead. They immediately notified Police Constable Chisholm, who took charge of the body.

# LIFEBOAT SINKS; 3 MEN PERISH

Watertown, N. Y., Nov. 6.—The third of three men who were drowned today when a lifeboat in which they had attempted to leave the grain freighter Glen Luchie, when she went aground at Charity Shoals, near the Main Duck channel in Lake Ontario, was crushed against the side of the ship, was identified tonight as Daniel Marchand, of Champlain, Quebec, a watchman. The others were Ernest Homsby, of Denmark, and John Brody, Montreal.

Three women and the rest of the crew of 20 were taken off in safety when Captain Victor Charles, of Champlain, worked his vessel, her decks awash, nine miles to Cape Vincent under her own power. The captain ran the ship on a mud shoal 200 feet offshore and there she sank. The freighter, carrying 86,000 bushels of wheat, was bound for Montreal from Port Colborne, Ontario, and struck a windstorm as she passed through the Main Duck channel.

# ST. STEPHEN MEN HAVE CLOSE CALL

St. Stephen, Nov. 6.—Two young men, named Thornton and Bonness, of Basswood Ridge, were fortunate in escaping sudden death last night when a small car in which they were driving crashed into the tender of the locomotive on the C. P. R. express.

They were coming out the Valley Road, just as the train arrived and, apparently, they did not see or hear the train until the car had struck the tender. The car was almost completely demolished but the young men escaped with only a few scratches.

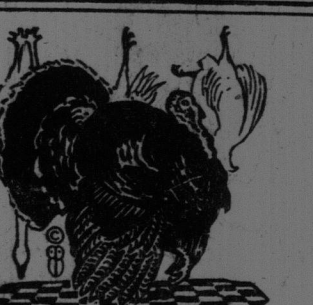
