

two detectives, who were waiting with
her, arrested him.

Bellefonte, Pa., March 5 — Floyd Smith, of Bradford County, Pa., was electrocuted at the Rockview Penitentiary today for the slaying of his infant child in South Waverly, Pa., in April, 1920. Continuous efforts since he was sentenced in February, 1921, had been made to save Smith from the electric chair, and until almost the last moment he was hopeful that Governor Pinchot would interfere.

The child Smith was accused of killing was born a few months after his marriage. According to Smith he started out at night to abandon it. Near a farmhouse in the vicinity of his home, he said, a dog barked and in attempting to run away, he fell upon the child, crushing it to death. Fearing he would be charged with murder, Smith said, he placed the body in a creek in South Waverly.

campaign for William Cunnea, lawyer


