London, March 23—Sir John Simon, one of the Independent Liberal leaders in the House of Commons, in an address to an assembly of Liberal candidates who had been defeated in elections, enunciated very dogmatically, as he himself expressed, the guiding Liberal principles and the Liberal foreign policy.
