the most solid grounds for congratulating the friends of the Inwith on the aspect of success and usefulness which it now ars. The strongest proof that can be adduced in corroboration our expectations, is that although there are several Branch So-eies from which no returns have as yet been made, and the aant of contributions from some of them noticed in the above arment, have not been paid in, yet the amount of what has alreabeen received exceeds the gross amount of the Society's funds the preceding year, up to the period of our remittance to the arent Society in May last, by upwards of one hundred pounds.

By two most liberal and seasonable grants from the Parent Soely, of 700 Bibles and 1500 Testaments, in addition to our Stock maining on hand from the former year, and of 170 Bibles and 15 Testaments received on account of our last remittance, your ommittee have been happily enabled to meet the numerous and mensive demands which have been made upon them during the ist year, and which in the amount of Copies of the Scriptures distriuted, exceeds by more than nine times that of the year preceding. There have been furnished to Branch Societies 343 Bibles and 12 Testaments.-175 Bibles and 349 Testaments have been dis-buted from the Depository at Halifax, in various ways either for e or gratuitously, making in all 578 Bibles and 1161 Testaments, in out for circulation in the Province, and there now remain on and, 696 Bibles, and 1421 Testaments, in various languages. This restock on hand, has arisen from the late season at which some the books arrived from England, and it will enable your Commite to meet the demands that are likely to be made early in the pring from various quaters.

Among the Scriptures distributed from the Depository at Halia, it may be proper to state that 22 Bibles, and 150 Testaments are been given gratis by the Gommittee, to the several Sunday chools established in Halifax; as they deemed it peculiarly suita-e to the views of the Society, to give every encouragement to use useful Institutions, as well as one of the most probable means to discontinue aproducing effectual good, to place the word of God in the hands of he ranks of our he rising generation.

But it is time that we should turn, and take a brief view of the
