Rates of Commission on Money Orders.

The rates of commission on Money Orders issued by any Money Order Office in Newfoundland to the United States of America, the Dominion of Canada and any part of Newfoundland are as follows:

For sums not exceeding \$10	5 cts
Over \$10 but not exceeding \$20	10 cts
Over \$20 but not exceeding \$50	15 cts
Over \$50 but not exceeding \$100	20 cts
Over \$100 but not exceeding \$200	25 cts
Over \$200 but not exceeding \$500	30 cts
Over \$500 but not exceeding \$1000	35 cts
Over \$1000 but not exceeding \$5000	40 cts
Over \$5000 but not exceeding \$10000	45 cts
Over \$10000 but not exceeding \$100000	50 cts

Maximum amount of a single Order is any of the above countries and at office in Newfoundland, \$100, but as many may be obtained as the remitter requires.

Proclamation

GEORGE the FIFTH, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

W. E. Davidson, Governor. [L. S.]

Whereas We deem it expedient and necessary to appoint Terms or Sessions for the holding of Our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of our Island of Newfoundland, at the several times and places hereinafter mentioned:

We do, therefore, declare to all our loving subjects in Our said Island that it is Our will and pleasure to direct and appoint that Our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of Our said Island, shall be open and holden—

At Brigus on Friday, the Sixteenth, and Saturday, the Seventeenth days of November next;

At Harbor Grace on Monday, the Nineteenth, Tuesday, the Twentieth, Wednesday, the Twenty-first, and Thursday, the Twenty-second days of November next.

At Carbonear on Friday, the Twenty-third, and Saturday, the Twenty-fourth days of November next.

And the said Court shall be kept open for the periods hereinafter prescribed at each of the respective places, as aforesaid provided the presiding Judge shall have business to do therein; and, if necessary, such Judge may extend the term at any of the said places for a period not exceeding two days, and until the determination of the trial of any case then proceeding.

And We do, by these Presents, further order and direct that in the event of a Judge who may preside in the said Court in the Northern District of Our said Island being prevented by unforeseen circumstances from opening Our said Court on any of the days hereinafter appointed, or if the said Judge should shortly arrive at any of the places hereinafter named for holding Our said Court before the time stated for the opening thereof, and shall deem it proper to open the same without delay, the said Judge may, and he is hereby authorized to open and hold Our said Court on any other day or days than those hereinafter specified; and to keep the same open for the respective periods hereinafter stated, as aforesaid, if he should find it necessary for the despatch of business to do so.

And of these Presents all Magistrates, the Sheriff, Officers of the Constabulary Force, and all Bailiffs, Constables, Keepers of goals; and all other officers in the execution of their offices about the premises, and all and singular other persons whom these Presents do, shall or may concern, are hereby required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under the Great Seal of Our aforesaid Island of Newfoundland.

Witness Our trusty and well beloved Sir WALTER EDWARD DAVIDSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our said Island of Newfoundland and its Dependencies, at St. John's, in Our said Island, this 24th day of July, A. D. 1917, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign.
