Cotton's Weekly is supplied by a six horse power gasolene engine. The International Harvester people figure that it takes a gallon a day per horse power to run these engines.

When Cotton's started publishing in Cowansville gasolene was fitteen cents a gallon, and there was no government power in Ontario. Today gasolene costs twenty-six cents a gallon. At present power costs us \$300 a year more than if we were in Berlin, or some other place where cheap power can be got.

When the circulation of Cotton's goes to \$6,800, we will have to install a rotary press, and, if we stay in Cowansville, install a 15 horse power engine. When we make the change, would it not be better to locate where we can get the cheaper power?
