The D. D. G. Sire then addressed the Representatives on the state and prosperity of the Order, and proceeded to instruct them in the Grand Lodge Degree, after conferring which, then were desired to elect their Officers for the current year.

Representative VanBrocklin, seconded by Rep. Yale, nominated D. D. G. Sire Reynolds as Grand Master.—Carried usanimously.

Rep. Sherwood, seconded by Rep. Ewing, nominated Rep. Dixon of Cobourg, as D. G. Master.

Rep. Morgan, seconded by Rep. Fletcher, nominated Rep. Yale of St. Catharines, as D. G. Master.

Rep. Reynolds, seconded by Rep. Van Brocklin, nominated Rep. Cameron as D. G. Master.

A ballot was taken, when Rep. Yale was declared elected Deputy Grand Master.

Rep. Cameron, seconded by Rep. Fitzsimmons, nominated Rep. Sherwood. Upon his declining the office, Rep. Sherwood, seconded by Rep. Cameron, named Rep. Fitzsimmons, who also declined. Rep. Fitzsimmons, seconded by Rep. Dixon, proposed Rep. Ewing, who declined. Rep. Yale nominated Rep. Dixon. This nomination was seconded by Rep. Ewing, whereupon Rep. Dixon was duly elected Grand Secretary.

Rep. Cook, seconded by Rep. Fitzsimmons, named Rep. Cameron Grand Warden, and he was declared duly elected.

Rep. Dixon, seconded by Rep. Ashton, nominated Rep. Claris for the Chair of Grand Treasurer, and he was duly elected.

Grand Master elect, Reynolds, named Rep. Sherwood Grand Marshall Rep. Ewing, Grand Conductor; and Rep. Fitzsimmons, Grand Guardian The D. D. G. Sire then proceeded to instal the D. G. Master, the G. Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Warden, and the Appointed Officers, after which the Grand Master was duly installed by the Deputy Grand
