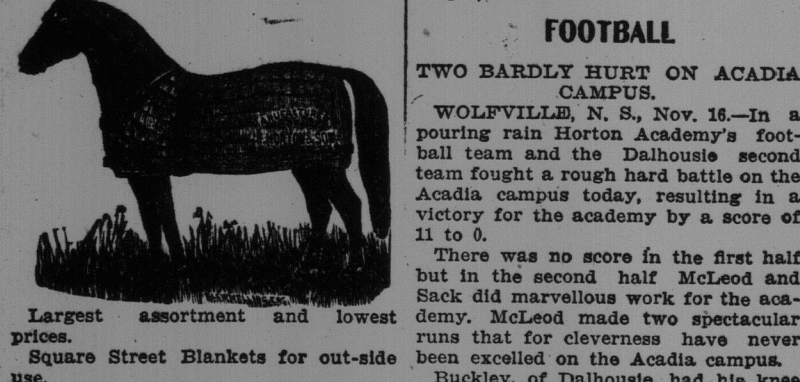

CAPTAIN DESROCHES WAS DROWNED
But Other Members of the Crew of the A. J. McKean Have Been Saved

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I., Nov. 16.—Captain Desroches of the schooner A. J. McKean, which was wrecked at Malone Point, a short distance from the Acadia campus today, resulting in a tragedy. The captain became exhausted under the terrible exposure and cried out that he could stand no longer. The sailors tried to assist him, but were powerless in their attempts. A terrible storm was blowing from the east, and the sea was running high. The schooner was fifty years of age and is survived by a wife and five children. The other members of the crew were terribly exhausted when rescued by a life saving crew.
