An Unexpected Murder - A Gardener Poisons a Family With Toadstools -One Member Dies.

On the evening of August 20, Dr. Diplock concluded an inquest at the King's Arms, Acton Bottom, upon the body of Ruth Brooks, who had been poisoned by eating some fungi, given her for mushrooms by George Hunt, a gardener, who had a few days before threatened

the inmates of the house. The testimony taken when at the first hearing was to the effect that Hunt was in the habit of going to the King's Arms for his beer, and that he frequently made the bar-maid and the deceased presents of vegetables and flowers. On Wednes-day morning, the 15th inst., he brought what he affirmed were mushrooms, and day morning, the 15th inst., he brought what he affirmed were mushrooms, and gave them to the bar-maid over the counter, telling her at the same time how to cook them. The deceased, who acted as cook, fried them as recommended, and three of the family partook of them for breakfast. They shortly afterward became very ill, and a medical man, Dr. Tenison of Hammersith. was sent for. Two of them recovered, but deceased gradually became worse, and died in great agony the same evening. A post-mortem examination revealed the fact that the stomach was in a high state of inflammation, caused by some irritant vegetable poison such as is found in the various fungi resembling mushrooms. Hunt, upon being cautioned, admitted giving them the fungus, but declared that he did not know they were of a poisonous nature. Upon being ques-
