BILT.

An Act to Assimilate the Tenure of Land in the Seigniory of Sault Saint Louis to that in the other Seigniories in this Province.

WHEREAS there is inherent in the Iroquois Indians of Sault Suint Preamble. Louis, otherwise called Caughnawaga, an amount of negligence and apathy with respect to the cultivation and improvement of their lands, the keeping in repair of roads, and the fulfilment of the other duties of proprietors, which is a continual source of inconvenience to the inhabitants of the neighboring parishes; and whereas it is expedient to put an end to this state of things; and whereas such a result would be attained by assimilating the tenure of land in the said Seigniory to that in the other Seigniories in this Province: Therefore Her Majesty, 10 by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:---

1. From and after the passing of this Act, every Iroquois Indian or Indian occuother Indian may transfer, convey, sell, or otherwise alienate in fee pant of land simple, (en pleine propriété,) any land or immovable property occupied in tur sen 15 by him within the limits of the said Seigniory, to any Indian or other convey it in person, as fully as any proprietor may do; and in case of the acquisi- fee simple to tion of any land in the said Seigniory by a white person, such person and the parmay settle upon such land, or in any other part of the said Seigniory, chaser, alnotwithstanding any law, regulation or custom to the contrary.
