An Act to amend the Petty Trespass Act of Upper Canada.

WHEREAS doubts have arisen under the section substituted by the Preamble. Act passed in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign, for the first section of the Act known as "An Act respecting Petty Tres- Con. Stat. U. passes in Upper Canada," chapter one hundred and five of the Consolidated C. c. 105. 5 Statutes for Upper Canada; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:--

1. The said section of the said Act is hereby repealed.

2. The following section shall be substituted for the said repealed sec- New section 10 tion, and shall in lieu thereof be read as the first section of the said Act, substituted. chapter one hundred and five of the Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada:—

"Any person who unlawfully enters into, comes upon, or passes No person to through, or in any way trespasses upon any land or premises, whatsoever enteror allow 15 being partly or wholly inclosed, or turns any horse, cattle, sheep, or his cattle to swine upon, or permits any such to go or range at large upon any land or land of anpromises whatever, being wholly inclosed, and being the property of other without any other person, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one dollar permission. or more than ten dollars for every such offence, irrespective of any dam-

20 age having or not having been occasioned thereby; and such penalty may be recovered with costs in every case of conviction, before any Justice of the Peace, who shall decide the matter in a summary way, and Penalty and award costs in case of conviction, which may be had either on view, or on how recoverconfession of the party complained against, or on the oath of one credi-

25 ble witness; but nothing herein contained shall extend to any case where Proviso. the party trespassing acted under a fair and reasonable supposition that he had a right to do the act complained of, or to any case within the meaning of the twenty-eighth section of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, respecting Arson and other malicious injuries to property.
