may be made that any Member who has risen "be now heard," or "do now speak."

Order in debate.

12. A Member called to order shall sit down, but may afterwards explain. The House, if appealed to, shall decide on the case, but without debate. If there be no appeal the decision of the chair shall be final.—B. 421, 432.

Decorum in debate.

13. No Member shall speak disrespectfully of Her Majesty, nor of any of the Royal Family, nor of the Governor or person administering the Government of Canada; nor shall he use offensive words against either House, or against any Member thereof; nor shall he speak beside the question in debate. No Member may reflect upon any vote of the House, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.—B. 410, 428, 411, 401. M. 364.

Reading the Question. 14. Any Member may require the question under discussion to be read at any time of the debate, but not so as to interrupt a Member while speaking.—B. 422.

No Member to speak twice. 15. No Member may speak twice to a question, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, in which he may have been misconceived, but then he is not to introduce new matter. A reply is allowed
