

# Student Union News

## Radical student motions

The following motions of a policy or program nature were passed at the September 16 meeting of the Student Union Council. Motion: That council approve, in principle, the Academic Commission's plan to invite Dr. Henry Morgentaler to lecture at UNB. Further, that council authorize the Academic Commission to negotiate a suitable arrangement and to report back to council for ratification.

Note: The Pro-life side of the argument will also be invited at a later date.

Whereas cigarette smok-

ing is the major alterable factor in the development of early coronary disease, chronic chest disease, carcinoma of the lung, cardiovascular diseases; and whereas exposure to second-hand smoke is a significant factor and a hazard to non-smokers, particularly to persons with respiratory, cardiovascular and other disease; and whereas the development of campus policies to protect the health and welfare of university students is an important responsibility of persons engaged in stu-

dent government; Be it resolved that the Council of the UNB Student Union

1. aims to totally eliminate smoking and smoke pollution from its working and social environment by discouraging smoking by Union members, visitors and staff.

2. prohibits smoking in meeting rooms and in the general office of the Student Union as well as establishing non-smoking zones in Union events.

3. orders that all ashtrays be removed from meeting

rooms and from the general office of the Student Union.

4. forbids all officers of the Student Union from negotiating a deal for the marketing or promotion of tobacco or smoking materials.

5. directs that copies of the resolution be posted in all offices of the Student Union.

Motion: a. Be it resolved that the UNB Student Union Council request the Board of Governors to allot tuition credits to the Stu-

dent Union Council on each campus in proportion to the total number of students on each campus.

d. Be it resolved that the Student Union Council officially request the Board of Governors to consider the matter of tuition credits at the September 20 meeting of the Board.

Motion: That council approve a Pub for October 31st (Finnigan).
