

# HONORS FOR

Although sculptor Louis Temporale has been honored with one of the highest distinctions a Canadian artist can receive, he isn't considering

"What else would I do," Temporale said at his Canadian Art Memorial shop in Port Credit. "Besides I love it

too much."

The love and skill that transforms granite or marble into art was recognized recently when Temporale was awarded membership into the prestigious Royal Canadian Academy of Arts.

Lieutenant-Governor Pauline Mc-Gibbon, her husband Donald W. Gibbon and former Erindale College principal J. Tuzo Wilson attended the recent award-ceremony and dinner in Tem-porale's honor at the Royal York Hotel

A member of the Sculptor Society of Canada and the Ontario Society of Artists, Temporale was one of six Canadian artists out of 280 nominees to be awarded R.C.A. membership.

Founded in 1880 by the Marquis of Lorne, then Governor-General of Canada, the academy is the senior visual arts society of Canada.

Its aims include encouragement, improvement and cultivation of painting, sculpture, architecture and design in the graphic, decorative and indus-trial arts as well as advancement of the National Gallery of Canada, which it

Election is based on a nominee's achievement of a high standard of excellence in his discipline.

In Temporale's case, this high

standard is in his work in memorial tombstones, religious and public commissions (For instance his King George VI statue on the Niagara

he admires Michaelangelo. Born in the northern Italian province of Udine, in the town of Maiano, Temporale began designing at an early age under the guidance of his father, a sculptor.

Temporale's formal education started at the State School of Design, tutored by sculptor Guiseppe Del Frabro. Temporale came to Canada in 1927 and continued his studies at Toronto's Central Technical School and Ontario College of Art (OCA). At OCA, he was guided by Elizabeth Wyn Wood and Emmanuel Hahn.

Besides the memorial tombstones

created at his Port Credit shop which has been expanded considerably since its opening before the Second World War, Temporale was commissioned for large-scale ornamental work on buildings in Toronto and Hamilton.

"This was before ornaments were done in pre-cast stone," he explains. "It took a long time to complete, since we handcut the stones."

In Toronto, the Temporale touch can

be seen on the Bank of Canada, the Archives building at the University of Toronto, the McLean Hunter building, the Bank of Montreal and at Ryerson

From ornamental panel work to religious statues or modern sculpting, Temporale's versatility is evident.

His marble sculpture entitled Abstract Form won the Cadillac Development Corp. award at an Ontario Society of Arts show.

His works have been exhibited at art galleries in Toronto, Montreal and Hamilton, as well as at the Torino Italian Centennial.

### Move to chop waterfront tape

Two "key people" will be should be made quickly designated by two provincial ministries to "cut red tape" that has plagued the approval process for Mississauga's Waterfront

Councillor Hazel has been trying to get the multi-million dollar plan under way, has met with environment minister William Newman and natural resources minister Leo Bernier.

She got a commitment from them that they would each designate someone with decision-making power to coordinate the program in connection with CVCA.

"We are trying to give every encouragement to cut out the red tape and get down to getting the job on the way," Mrs. McCallion said. She added that if the ministry of the environment detailed en-

"The ministry has been asking for data we can't seem to supply," Mrs. McCallion stressed.

At the last meeting of the water-management advisory board, several mem-bers were highly critical of McCallion, chairman of Credit Valley Conservation

Members were upset that technical data gathered by Environmental Consultants Ltd., in turn hired by Crysler and Lathem, were not available for committee review. Blake Goodings, chairman of a technical subcommittee dealing with the Waterfront

Plan, said he was not satisfied with Environmental Consultants' work to date.

"If we paid for this, we got had," he said. "Some of this stuff is absolute balderdash," added Dr. John Ladell, a board member.


