

Ottawa, 27th March, 1900-

Sir,

Referring to your letter of the 23rd Instant, I have to inform you that the Resolution of the Council of the Moravians of the Thames, recommending a re-Survey of the roads on the Reserve, was not enclosed with your letter.

The cost of a re-survey of the roads only, would be a large proportion of the cost of the Survey of the entire Reserve. The Council has applied on one or more occasions to have a re-survey made of the Reserve by a Surveyor of the Department. The work at Headquarters will not admit of a Surveyor from the Department being detailed at present, to make the Survey. You were informed to this effect on the 14th March last.

The Survey of the entire Reserve is evidently required, and as the Band has ample funds, the Council should pass a Resolution requesting that the work be done.
