A. Were you allowed out? Q. Yes, sir. A. Where did you go? Where did you go from Depot. Q. I went to Wetaskiwin. A . How many weeks were you there? Q. About 2 months, sir. A. Q. Where were you in the end of May, 1944? Wetaskiwin, sir. A. Q. Were you performing a military duty? A. Yes, sir. Did you perform military duties during the month of May? Q. I am not just sure, sir. A. Was there any time at Wetaskiwin in which you did not perform Q. military duty? Not at Wetaskiwin, sir. Q. I understand - I understood you to tell the Court that you had only one week-end while you were stationed at Wetaskiwin? Where were you in the month of June. Wetaskiwin. A. Where were you on the 18th of June? or the 19th of June, or Q. the 20th or 21st of June? I don't know, sir. A. Your memory is quite clear to you. Your life dates back to 1929. surely you can tell me where you were in June, on the 19th, 20th or 21st of June? Q. I spent most of my time in the Guard House at Wetaskiwin. A . Is that where you were on the 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st of June? Were you in the Guard House? I don't know, sir. A. If I told you Althhofen that you were in the Guard Housefrom the 21st of June, 1944, until the 24th of June, 1944, would you say that was true? Q. I wouldn't know for certain, sir. I was away for a couple of days. Q. Was it two days? I think, sir, it was two days or three days. A.
