Swann, C.M.P. who was on duty at Coventry requesting me to contact the Canadian Provest Corps regarding No. G.51220 Sgt. Logan, No. 7 Cd I.R.U., I was informed that this N.C.O. was wearing a chevron on one arm only and that Cpl Swann was not satisfied with his statements. I contacted the Canadian Provost Corps with his statements. I contacted the Canadian Provost Corps with his statements. I contacted the Canadian Provost Corps with his M.B.M.l had been stolen. Therefore the supposed Sgt that he was at that time with his unit also that he had reported that he was at impostor. I was requested to place this man Logan must be an impostor. At C.M.P.H.Q., I informed L/Cpl Swann of this and Pte Harte admitted to L/Cpl Swann that his statements had been false. He was then conveyed to Budbrook Barracks and handed over to the N.C.O. I/C Guard to await escort. He was sober.
